BOMADERRY TIGERS

It's an exciting time for the Bomaderry Tigers with both men's and women's teams making the jump up to premier division, as well as the revitalisation of Artie Smith oval.

The Tigers men's team will be looking to make a splash straight away in the premier division this year, with the side featuring in a division one grand final in 2023. Premier Division Coaches Jack Boxsell and Jake Satchell emphasised how much their side were looking forward to the challenge, stating "we're all looking forward to it, we've had a good pre-season so far with a bit of an injection of youth through the juniors and some new recruits".

The club also highlighted just how exciting it is to be able to use the brand-new facilities at Artie Smith Oval, adding "just training has been unreal on it and the facilities are top notch".

The Bomaderry women's side will also take the step up into premier division for the 2024 season, and after a slightly disappointing 2023 campaign in division one, are confident they can bounce back against their new competition. Vice President Brent Tyrell was bullish about the team's prospects, noting "we've been working really hard, in terms of the team we've recruited a few new players, and also quite a few returning players from our premiership side, and those girls have come in and really set a good standard".

With a revamped home and both men's and women's teams competing at a higher level, it's shaping up to be a hugely exciting year for Bomaderry.



FIGTREE KANGAROOS

Figtree have been a powerhouse of the competition across both their men's and women's premier division teams for years now and aren't showing signs of slowing down just yet.

The men's premier division side last season capped off a historic 'three-peat' with their grand final win over Northern Districts, and first year coach, Brandon Lagana is confident his group has done more than enough preparation to attempt a fourth, stating "we had a lot of the boys training for marathons and whatnot coming into pre-season, so they sort of had a jump on pre-season before I even got to training".

Lagana also credited the leadership of the groups' senior players for making the transition an easy one, adding "it's been a pretty simple transition going from player to coach just due to the fact there was so many leaders around the club who can take the reins when they need to". Premier division captain Jacob Hennessey also touted Jacob May, Darcy Hennessey, and the groups' younger players as ones to watch in season 2024.

The women's premier division team enter 2024 after back-to-back grand final appearances, and with new coach Kyle Emley at the helm, are confident it can be their year to break through with their Captain saying the group have "done our hard yards over the off-season and in the pre-season, we've got a bloody good coach, a good team, and good vibes" and are ready to give the year a "red hot crack".

Emley also expressed his excitement for the competition as a whole with the three new sides entering the premier division, stating "What we want holistically is to have a stronger competition, so getting those clubs involved is really important for the sustainability and growth of the area in terms of the footy, we want to make it an attractive place for people to play footy, we want talent to be staying down here and growing the women's game more broadly".

Both Figtree's men's and women's teams look poised to give the competition a shake again in season 2024, promising an exciting year ahead.



KIAMA POWER

Things are looking promising at Bonaira Oval for the 2024 season, with the men's side confident they can re-join the finals race, and last year's division one grand final winning women's side being one of the three teams moving up to premier division.

Kiama hasn't been in the finals mix in the men's premier division as of late, but the side is maturing according to Kiama President Rod Richards, who said "the average age last year was under 18's and we've got a few older bodies coming back, and we've got the younger bodies still there being guided" as well as stating that with this added maturity in the team "we think we're in for a much better year than last year". Richards predicted the side to be around the mark for finals hoping for "around third, fourth or fifth".

It is a different story for the women's side however who are stepping up from division one after winning the grand final in a dominant display to finish last season. The club is excited about moving up into the premier division after such a successful 2023, Richards stating "it's a natural progression after winning a flag to go up to prems, everyone wants to play in the highest (division) they can".

The prospects of the women's team after moving up a division mirrored the men's, Richards adding that "if we can run third or fourth or thereabouts and compete, we'll be happy with that".

Much to look forward to for the Kiama Power this year with both teams looking to make some noise.



NORTHERN DISTRICTS TIGERS

The Northern Districts Tigers will be hoping to build on a really successful 2023 campaign and have the added excitement of their women's team stepping up into premier division.

The Men's Premier Division side had a brilliant finish to 2023, defeating the Bulldogs in a preliminary before ultimately going down to Figtree in the decider, and are looking to go one better in 2024. Coach Glenn Haase is confident and optimistic that his young side have continued to mature and improve, stating "I think we're going in pretty strong, we're going in confident that's for sure, the boys have gotten a year older, we're a young team we know that, and we've gotten older and more experienced which is really starting to show at training".

The Tigers men will also go in with a largely unchanged line-up with "a few good ins" according to Haase, always a good sign for a reigning grand finalist.

On top of the hype around the men's side, the Northern Districts women's side who made last year's division one grand final and won one the year before, are taking the step up into the premier division a move described as "daunting, but exciting".

The club also expressed their excitement over the number of players on the track for the preseason, with the team also picking up a win over the Camden Cats in a practice match recently.

One of the strongest sides in women's division one over the past handful of seasons, the Tigers girls look to make their mark on the premier division, while the men's side are primed to get back to the big dance and try and go one further.



SHELLHARBOUR SUNS

The youth movement continues in Shellharbour after the side broke through in 2023 to participate in their first finals series in the premier division for a few years.

Coach Dan Posch stated that "we have our expectations set pretty high after last year, making the finals for the first time for a few years for the club was terrific and to do it with more than half our team rolling into finals being teenagers, we have that on our side". Posch is really excited to have kept the core group of young players together and continue to develop as well as bringing in some recruits for season 2024, he said "we've kept everyone together and we've got a few inclusions, I guess we'll find out early in the season where they fit and where that has us, but we're expecting to take a step forward.

Team captain, Jarod Falconer also shared his optimism for the upcoming campaign, stating "the playing group we've got at the moment and the buzz around it is probably the best I've seen in my tenure at the suns". Club president, Stephen Ashworth mirrored his excitement particularly to see the continued development of the junior players without the burden of playing both junior and senior football over the same weekend, his players to watch this year are Brendan Cooper and Harry McDonald.

The Suns look primed for another strong season in 2024.



WOLLONGONG BULLDOGS

The Bulldogs have been hovering around the top of the ladder in both the men's and women's competitions for the last handful of seasons, but the club is bullish that season 2024 can be the year they break through.

The Men's Premier Division team's 2023 season ended in a preliminary final loss to a fast-finishing Northern Districts side, in what was a "little bit disappointing" in the words player Dan O'Bryan after losing only two games in the home and away season and defeating eventual premier Figtree early in the year. The side remains confident however that they will remain one of the teams to beat in this year's season after going in with a largely unchanged team, with the exception of some veteran players departing and some younger players joining the club.

O'Bryan also added that "the boys have been looking really good in the pre-season" and expressed confidence that the side could "get back to the grand final like a couple of years ago and hopefully go one further".

The Women's Premier Division side experienced a similar finish to their 2023 campaign, going down in a preliminary final to Figtree. Coach Allie Phillips has stated the loss was "disappointing but we treat it as new year new us" and expressed her excitement for "an influx of new girls coming in and massive numbers". Phillips described the 2024 campaign as a "changing of the guard" with several departing players, but she and new coach Tom Stevenson are excited for the opportunity that will provide for others to step up, touting Abbey Thomas and Paris Taity as players to watch as they've been "training the house down".

With a big pre-season in the books and round one against cross-town rivals the Lions just around the corner, the Bulldogs look poised to make some noise in the competition again this season.



Wollongong Lions

The Wollongong Lions look poised for a successful 2024 season with some new faces joining the men's squad and the women's side not having lost a single game in their last campaign.

The Lion's men's premier division team finished fifth in 2023, narrowly missing finals, but coach Will Judd is aiming higher for season 2024, stating "I think the benchmark for us should be finals, we missed out last year by probably 25 minutes of footy in a match against Shellharbour". Judd's optimism is not without merit, he explained how the team "tried to have a bit of a recruitment drive and really strengthen our game plan" and was confident that this work behind the scenes would equate to more wins in season 2024.

The women's side could not have had a more successful campaign to build on than the one they did in 2023, not only winning the grand final but completing the entire season undefeated. 2024 however, is a new season, and with three new teams entering the premier division the competition is shaping to be more challenging. Coach Nick Bretherton is relishing the opportunity for more competition in the division, stating that "a strong competition is a more enjoyable competition for everyone". Bretherton also expressed his confidence in the side in their bid for another grand final win despite the loss of a few players, he noted that there would be a "few changes in positions this year" and that the team was looking "really strong".

The Wollongong Lions are prepared for what is shaping up to be a highly exciting and competitive season for them.


